As for race 2, well my trip for the Sunday World Challenge race at the Detroit GP was a wash, actually a wash out, canceled due to the standing water on the track. I was able to ferry Dan and another staff member to the airport after very nearly getting really stuck in the parking lot.

So, as with many things in life, when God closes one door He opens another. While I miss Nelson, I am blessed to be serving for 2 great series whose staff and teams have welcomed me. Pro is good! Mid-Ohio and Road America here I come. What door is God opening for you?
