REMARKS - Reed Kryder

Don't miss the membership meeting on December 2nd. Santa Claus may be there with some early Christmas gifts.

I have been giving some thought as to what I would like to accomplish during my year as Regional Executive. One objective is to increase the number of active MVR members. About now you are saying “been there, done that”. We have tried numerous ways to increase membership and member participation over the years. They have all met with limited, if any, success. The SCCA National office is always publishing ways to increase membership and they offer a large number of ways to help in that regard.

But I think we miss one important item in all of these approaches. It seems as if we approach a potential member with lots of enthusiasm and then expect them to jump into our activities immediately. I might even compare it to being invited to a friends house for a party and, after arriving, finding out you are being subjected to a sales pitch for some product. This approach may work for some people, but I believe it has the opposite effect on the majority and they feel reluctant to return. Even when they had a good time.

I would like to see our members simply invite their friends, family members, and neighbors to the track to have a good time. No strings attached. If they have a good time they will return for future events and eventually ask how to become involved.

Another advantage of this approach is that you can invite the whole family to the track. Maybe you are just targeting one individual, but if their family comes along and the spouse, or especially the kids, have a good time, odds are they will return.

For example, let's say you are thinking of inviting a friend out to help wrench on your car or work a corner station with you. If this person has a family, consider extending an invitation to all of them to simply come and watch. Your involvement in the track activities, whether you are driving, waving flags, or involved in some other aspect of the action will increase their enjoyment. And it might lead to future members.

So as we head into the new year let's start extending some early invitations to our friends to come out to the race track and have some fun. No strings attached.

2008 NeDiv Mini Con - Reed Kryder

Sandi and I attended the NeDiv Mini-Con on November 7-9. The Mini-Con is held annually in the fall and topics center on scheduling, reviewing the past season, and changes for the upcoming year. The Round-Table is held in the spring and concentrates on training for the coming year.

The scheduling meeting was more intense than in the past few years. Both MVR and the DC Regions asked for Double Nationals. And to make it more interesting, the dates requested were back-to-back. NeDiv has a rule against Double Nationals but there has been one at Pocono for many years. We had several arguments ready to put forth in support of our event, including the fact it was on a three-day weekend. But eventually both requests were withdrawn. Steel Cities Region and MoHud Region requested Nationals at BeaveRun and Lime Rock (respectively) on the same weekend. Neither region had any flexibility and a vote was taken. Steel Cities lost and there will be no national at BeaveRun in 2009. As a follow-up note: the fact only a single NeDiv National exists in the western regions of NeDiv has several drivers strongly considering switching their Region of Record to a Great Lakes Region. From a logistics standpoint it makes a lot of sense for them to switch. I hope they retain dual memberships in anticipation of more NeDiv Nationals in our area in 2010.

I attended the Tech Inspectors meeting and came away impressed with the importance of meetings like this to get everyone enforcing the rules the same way. Just as many of us have experienced, there were different rule interpretations expressed during the meeting. Some of these differences are the result of tech inspectors confusing SCCA and NASA rules. Others result from rumors gaining validity over time. One very good suggestion was made regarding conflicts, whether they are between drivers and tech inspectors or tech inspectors themselves. One person said "whenever they are in discussions which start to get heated, they suggest looking at the rulebook for the exact wording." This approach tends to diffuse anger while making sure the correct decision is made. Another side note: I have personally used this approach to resolve disputes on my cars. I just ask: Show me the rule in the book. Another note: I have also been proven wrong using this approach.

Another item from the Tech Meeting was a clarification to rules enforcement. Historically, if you brought a car through tech and something was not legal, you could ask the Chief Steward for a waiver for that event. If the Chief Steward felt compassion towards your plight they might okay you for the weekend and make a note in your logbook to correct the problem before you race again. The Chiefs no longer have that option if the problem is a safety item. If your seat belts are out of date, you haven't installed the second passenger side door bar, your helmet is not legal, your roll bar has incomplete welding, or any number of other safety items which may

make you non-compliant you will need to correct them immediately if you plan on racing that weekend.

The Driver's Forum consisted of Bob Dowie, Terry Ozment, and Tom Hoffman fielding questions from the audience. The interest in the Run-Offs is very high after the announcement of its moving to Road America. A record turnout is expected. There will be only 24 races at the Run-Offs, but a 25th class (T-3) could be added. The results of the SCCA Surveys expressed a strong desire for separate races for everyone at the Run-Offs. But the survey also showed a high percentage in favor of combining classes IF there was a deserving class beyond the top twenty-four, rather than exclude them from the program.

At the Saturday evening banquet we picked up Amy Ruman's plaque for her 2009 GT-1 Championship in NeDiv. We also heard our own Dave Badger mentioned for receiving the Tech Worker of the Year award.

Most of the other meetings I attended were interesting, but had nothing of great value to express in this report. Maybe Sandi has some reports from the meetings she attended.

2008 NeDiv Mini-Con - Sandi Kryder

I attended several meetings, but the most important item discussed was in the Registrars seminar. SCCA National is introducing a hard card in 2009.

The hard card will be free to members holding a competition license and volunteer workers who worked a minimum of 4 days in 2008. All others will have to pay \$10.00.

An annual waiver (different from the normal waiver) must either be notarized or witnessed by an SCCA registrar. Photo must accompany the waiver when sent to the National office. Upon receipt at National, they will issue you a hard card.

The annual waivers can be requested at the time of your membership renewal in 2009.

Having a hard card does not mean that you do not have to go to registration. All drivers, crew & workers must go to registration to get their credentials. The hard card merely means that you do not have to sign a waiver at each event.

2008 Championship Runoffs - By the Numbers **From National Office**

While it comes as no surprise that the number of competitors was lower than 2007. Here is a brief look at the numbers:

Total Number of Competitors: 501, down about 23% in comparison to 2007

DSR, F500, T1, FF and GT2 had less than 10% drop in competition

SRF, S2000 and FA had greater than 40% drop in competition

A number of factors may have contributed to the decline; economy, fuel prices, facilities and competing clubs/hobbies were a few that I have heard mentioned. As leaders of our club, we can choose to accept that this is our fate, or we can take a fresh look at our competition programs. Are we doing everything we can to create an atmosphere that is simple and fun to be involved in? I encourage everyone to stay involved and start thinking out of the box. If you haven't contacted competition license holders in your region, you should. Find out what they want out of an event. There is no need to guess, pick up the phone and ask.
