Brad Morris made a motion to to accept the Treasurer's Report as read. Seconded by Tom Nutter. Motion passes.

Old Business:

Report from the November 14-15 Nediv Mini-Con - Reed Kryder

Paul Morrison, Sandi, and I traveled to the event Marlborough, Ma. event. It was a long drive (600+ miles) and we were thankful there were no Sunday meetings scheduled, thus allowing us to make it home at a reasonable hour. We don't know whether the three-day format will return, but for this year it was welcome.

Both Sandi (Divisional Administrator for Registration) and Paul (DA for Tech) conducted seminars for their areas during Saturday afternoon. Beside attending several meetings, I was involved in all of the scheduling

activities. The Divisional Racing Committee continues to function rather well and only a couple of rule adjustments were made for the 2015 Nediv Divisional Racing Series. One rule was limiting the number of participating tracks to eight. The 2015 schedule is:

April 11-12	Summit Point
May 23-25	New Hampshire
June 6-7	New Jersey
June 20-21	Nelson Ledges
July 25-26	Watkins Glen
August 8-9	Pocono
September 19-20	PIRC
October 9-10	Thompson

You must run at least four of the events to be eligible to receive the Championship Award in a class. We saw the 2014 awards during the Mini-Con Banquet and they were extremely impressive. This was the first year for the series and everyone felt it was a success. One of the goals of the series is to create something worthwhile which encourages traveling to other tracks. The impressive trophies are part of the plan. Separation of events, thus allowing preparation and planning by competitors, is another primary consideration. Having the series be a path to the Run-Offs is actually considered a bonus to the series and not its primary function.

You might have noticed the absence of Lime Rock on the schedule. This wasn't any kind of "slight" directed towards them, it simply was difficult to find a good slot for them on the 2015 calendar. This discussion was also part of what led to the eight-event limit for the series. The DRC had decided last year to consider inclusion of new tracks after their first year of operation. Thompson opened in 2014 and has a 2015 date as part of the next year's series. Palmer has been paved and has two race weekends (non-Div Series) scheduled in 2015. If all goes well they will be looking to host a 2016 Div Series weekend. There are two other new NeDiv tracks currently under construction (earth is being moved) and planning on running their first events in 2015. The DRC scheduling meeting for the 2016 season could be very interesting. It was decided that with a lot more than eight possible tracks in 2016 we needed some criteria for making selections in the future. Keeping all the tracks involved by rotations was discussed, but the primary piece of criteria was to keep the eight events separated on the schedule in order to allow time between them for competitors to prepare for the next one.

Discussions were held between myself, Charley Tanck (Finger Lakes Region), and Bill Stewart (Misery Bay Region) regarding the June 20-21 Nelson Ledges races. MVR and FLR are planning on making this a big, jointly sanctioned weekend. If track rental is reasonable for Friday we expect Misery Bay to join the fun with several other activities such as PDX, Club Trials, etc.

There were two major presentations by the SCCA National Office. They were targeted mainly towards club growth and member relations at the Region levels. This was the first time they presented them and further presentations are expected, including at the National Convention.
