CONGRATULATION TO DAVID PINTARIC
STO winner at the 2010 SCCA National
Championship Races held at Road America

The Mahoning Valley Region is a “racing region”. Nothing against solo, rallies, and other SCCA activities. It’s just we have many members who actively, and successfully, race in Regionals and Nationals. Our participation at this year’s National Championships at Road America (otherwise called the Run-Offs) really put an emphasis on the “successful” part of the above sentence.

David Pintaric qualified on the pole, set a Run-Offs lap record, and won the STO race. It wasn’t a run-away. The top three drivers swapped spots during the three days of qualifying before David finally ended up on the pole. The initial start saw David emerge in the lead after a three-way fight into the first turn. A restart (due to a BIG crash in the T-1 field) had David again in the lead early, only to be passed by the third place qualifying BMW. David was closely pursued by the outside pole qualifier as he chased the BMW. The race continued between these three drivers with all of them driving faster than they qualified. David really turned up the pressure on the last lap (it was the record setter) and with two turns to go something happened (briefly) to the BMW. David was by in a flash and took the win. The BMW recovered for second with the Corvette not too far behind in third. A lot of MVR people and friends were celebrating.

On a personal note: While Kryderacing has helped a couple of National Champions in the past, this was the first win for a car built (completely) and maintained in our shop. We are extremely proud of Matt Miller, Matt Carson, Jerry Palmer, and several others for their contributions during the past season.

Amy Ruman qualified and finished third in the big GT1 field. This was her best start and finish in several Run-Offs events. She has also been running strong in Trans-Am races this year with many podium finishes. Could a win be in the near future? The final Trans Am race is this weekend at Road Atlanta.

Last year’s MVR Driver of the Year, Sedat Yelkin, finished fourth in the FA race (just ahead of his dad, Ahsen). They both had great races after several problems earlier in the week. There were a few vehicle gremlins to handle and a “blow-over” of their massive canopy during a day of extremely high winds. There was also a Frank Howard listed on the entry sheets but we never saw his name on any timing sheets. The entry sheet showed him as a MVR member from Dayton, Ohio. Anyone know what happened? That’s a win, a third, and a fourth from the three MVR drivers (Ahsen Yelkin belongs to Steel Cities Region) who raced in the event. Pretty impressive. There was one additional MVR driver and he might have also been on the podium except for a blown engine during the week. David Strittmatter has been strong all year in his FP car and we were all hoping for another impressive performance. Maybe next year.

The 2010 National Championship Runoffs have been run and that brings an end to this year’s nation racing season. Four Mahoning Valley Region drivers won Divisional Championships David Pintaric in STO, Amy Ruman in GT-1, David Strittmatter in FP, and Sedat Yelkin in FA. A big thumbs up to the Divisional Champions. All four attended the Runoffs and ran well except for David Strittmatter who lost an engine in the third round of qualifying. A long tow but he at least he ran well in qualifying. David Pintaric had a good run for the win in STO, Amy Ruman took a strong Bronze Medal for third in GT-1, and Sedat Yelkin ended up fourth in FA after a mad scramble with a late race full course yellow and restart.

A quick scan of the national points in the Northeast Division shows eight other drivers scored national point this season and deserve a nod as well. Frank Howard ended up 5th in FA, Reed Kryder 9th in EP, Scott Lunder 8th in FP, Dale Gebhart 15th in AS, Robert Mazza 2nd in STU, Allen Milarcik 12th in STU, Jim Tibor 16th in SRF. And Greg Grucella 19th in SRF. By the way that’s 16th and 19th out of 44 in SRF, pretty good for drivers running only the local races.

Regional races are still scheduled at Mid-Ohio, Watkins Glen, and Summit Point in October so we will have to wait another mother before looking back at the accomplishments of our regional competitors.
