If you follow Formula 1 on TV, you have heard the likeable Brit Will Buxton as the onsite and pit road reporter. (Why do you have to have an accent to get the good jobs?) When he is not at the races he occasionally does some lifestyle shows on F1. Earlier this spring, Will and his producer got to take the Road to Ferrari. Picking up a loaner Ferrari FF after the Hungarian Grand Prix (don't we all), they took a road trip to Maranello. Along the way they stopped at a passionate master coach builder, the Carrozzeria Franco. There Will drove a classic Fiat 500. When one of the owner brothers was offered the chance to drive the Ferrari he declined. Why? He had just got his license back and did not want to lose it again.

Next stop was Pininfarina, the family owned designer with the historic ties to Ferrari and a passion for beautiful cars and coincidentally the designer of the FF.
