REMARKS (Part 2) - Reed Kryder

Our membership level has been constant for several years now. That's good. But we are not growing and I have been trying to figure out why, and come up with ideas to encourage growth. Why do I think we need to grow?

Recently I was watching a nature show and, as with many such shows, it partially dealt with the possibility of extinction of its subject animal. If you have followed the logic of any of these scenarios you know that once the herd decreases below a certain number it is impossible for the species to survive into the future. I don't feel the "MVR herd" is at that point, but there are a couple of things happening which hinder growth.

First off is a smaller Region comes into contact with prospective members less frequently than a larger Region. It's simple mathematics. It's also why "the strong get stronger and the weak get weaker". What can we do about it? We have to work harder than average at attracting new members and offering fun activities.

Another trend I have noticed is promotion of our events, especially our races. I think we do a great job of keeping our members informed of what events are in the future, but what about reaching out to non-members? It is becoming common to hear things like "Oh, I didn't know you had an event planned for the upcoming weekend?" This comment is also heard regarding many non-MVR events. Years ago Event Registrars spent a fortune mailing out hundreds, maybe thousands, of entries. Now we depend on the internet and word-of-mouth to reach non-members. During the past year the SCCA event mailings omitted one of our events and positioned another on the incorrect weekend. I don't think we can depend on them when our health is at stake. When I attend the National Convention I hear of lots of ways to promote events, but most entail significant amounts of time and/or monetary investment. As a small Region, many of these suggestions simply are not practical. We need ideas. In the meantime, work the "word of mouth" approach as much as possible. Look at everything we have planned for our September event and then look around amongst your friends. Surely you know someone who would have a great time participating in one or more of these activities.



A third area, and I have mentioned this before, is outside sponsorship for some of our activities. If there is someone you think might be able to help in some way I suggest the following approach. Get them involved in MVR first. Perhaps as a spectator while crewing for you, or perhaps by asking them to bring their teenager to the Street Survival event, or maybe let them drive your race car in the September CRE event. I know the last item is a stretch, but however you get your friends involved, MVR wins. Even if we can't think of a "win-win" sponsorship proposal to present to them at some future date, we have another active member. And that's a good thing.

I also want to promote the Legendary Marques event on September 7 as a way to introduce your friends to our hobby. It is not a SCCA event, but if you go to the www.legendarymarques.com website you will find it is just the type of program to offer excitement and fun to a potential member.

Mahoning Valley Region has long been known as "The Friendly Region". We still are. But we all need to direct that image to anyone around us who could be a new member. A larger "MVR herd" should be a healthier "MVR herd".
